

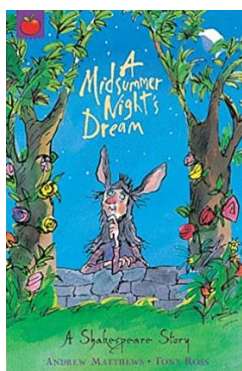
Year 3 Newsletter

What the children will be learning...
